Local Law No. 1 of the year 2008

A local law CONVERSION FROM THREE ELECTED ASSESSORS TO ONE APPOINTED ASSESSOR.

Be it enacted by the TOWN BOARD of the Town of GUILFORD as follows :

Section I. Title: Conversion from three elected assessors to one appointed assessor.

Section II. Authority: This local law is adopted pursuant Real Property Tax Law, Section 328.

Section III. Intent: It is the intent of this local law to abolish the board of three elected assessors in the Town of Guilford and to substitute therefore a single appointed assessor to be appointed pursuant to Real Property Tax Law 310.

Section IV. Abolition of the Offices of the Board of Three Elected Assessors: The offices of the three elected assessors as previously established and continued by the Town of Guilford are hereby abolished. The terms of office of the board of three elected assessors shall terminate on December thirty-first of the year in which this local law shall take effect.

In place and stead of the board of three elected assessors, the Town of Guilford shall have one (1) single assessor to be appointed by the Town Board of the Town of Guilford.

Section V. Inconsistency: All other local law and ordinances of the Town of Guilford that are inconsistent with the provisions of this local law are hereby repealed; provided however, that such repeal shall only be to the extent of such inconsistency and in all other respects this local law shall be in addition to such other local laws or ordinances regulating and governing the subject matter covered by this local law.

Section VI. Savings Clause: If any clause, sentence, paragraph, word, section or part of this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder, thereof, but shall be confined in its operation of the clause, sentence, paragraph, worked section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

Section VII. Term of Office: The appointed assessor shall fill the remainder of a six year term of office from October 1, 2007 thru September 30, 2013, consistent with Real Property Tax Law, Section 310.

Section VIII. Referendum Clause: Pursuant to section 328 of the Real Property Tax Law, the Town Board of the Town of Guilford has opted not to have a referendum on this matter.

Section IX Effective Date: This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing of this law with the Secretary of State. Pursuant to section 328 of Real Property Tax Law and the term of all elected assessors shall terminate December 31, 2008.
